

# Terms & Conditions – Demo Access

## 1. General Provisions

1.1. These Terms & Conditions set out the rules for accessing and using the Sylius demo made available via the Sylius website by **Sylius Sp. z o.o.**, a company incorporated under the laws of Poland, with its registered office in Opole, Poland (“Provider”).

1.2. By submitting an email address and launching the demo, the User accepts these Terms & Conditions.

## 2. Definitions

- **User** – a person providing an email address to access the demo.
- **Demo** – a live version of the Sylius eCommerce platform configured for B2C, B2B, or Marketplace scenarios.
- **Personal Data** – data relating to the User, in particular an email address, as defined under the GDPR.

## 3. Access to the Demo

3.1. Access to the Demo is free of charge and for evaluation purposes only.

3.2. The Demo is provided “as is” and may contain simplified or experimental configurations.

3.3. The Provider reserves the right to suspend or terminate access at any time without prior notice.

## 4. Use of Personal Data

4.1. The User’s email address will be processed for:

- granting access to the Demo, and
  - contacting the User once to offer consultancy, implementation guidance, or training related to Sylius.
- 4.2. The Provider does not send newsletters or marketing emails without the User’s explicit consent.
- 4.3. The rules for data processing are further detailed in the **Privacy Policy**, which forms an integral part of these Terms & Conditions.

## **5. Liability**

5.1. The Demo is provided solely for demonstration and evaluation.

5.2. The Provider shall not be liable for any damages, including indirect or consequential damages, arising from the use or inability to use the Demo, except as required by mandatory law.

## **6. Amendments**

6.1. The Provider may amend these Terms & Conditions at any time.

6.2. The amended version will be published on the website and becomes effective upon publication.

## **7. Governing Law and Jurisdiction**

7.1. These Terms & Conditions are governed by Polish law.

7.2. Any disputes shall be settled by the competent courts in Poland for the seat of the Provider.
